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### **Japan Fair Trade Commission Decision**

The Japan Fair Trade Commission (hereinafter referred to as the “JFTC”) today issued cease and desist orders and a surcharge payment order of 4.29 million yen under Japan’s Antimonopoly Act to ITOCHU Corporation (hereinafter referred to as “ITOCHU”) for its activities regarding its supply of uniforms to NTT DOCOMO, INC.

As announced in the disclosure document titled “Receipt of Draft Cease and Desist Orders and Surcharge Payment Order Regarding the Supply of Uniforms” published on 6 August 2018, this matter forms part of the same JFTC investigation into ITOCHU’s past uniform business activities and practices that took place before FY 2017. ITOCHU has at all times provided its full support to and cooperation with the JFTC investigation into ITOCHU’s past uniform supply, including this matter, and ITOCHU has already implemented new preventive measures\* .

ITOCHU commits itself to sustain further efforts to both maintain and reinforce its compliance with the Antimonopoly Act, and with all other laws.

#### **Future Outlook**

These orders will have no effect on the net profit attributable to ITOCHU of 500 billion yen announced on 1 October 2018.
